As a democratic country, India is built on the foundations of the election. Our Parliament and Legislatures are of the people, by the people, and for the people. Voting is a constitutional right that we are privileged to have. The constitution has given us the right to elect who we want, the right to make the change.

#### **EVERY VOTE COUNTS**

Though it seems like an endless sea of people are there to vote, every vote counts. When the national attitude changes from thinking "my vote doesn't make a difference", then the numbers increase and a multitude of people voting will make the difference. The responsibility lies on every individual.

With an aim to educate people about voting and make the process of obtaining a voter's ID easier for them, we organized a Voter's Registration Drive. Focusing on maximizing the impact of a vote, we **collaborated with 67 other clubs** from our Zone.

This project aimed at registering at least 2000 new voters to motivate the youth to vote. We made the process easier for registrants by registering them for the voter ID ourselves.

he only thing the registrants had to do was send their documents and help us with the details.

Additionally, we also helped registrants with corrections in details, finding their EPIC ID, applying for a new hard copy of the voter's ID, etc. Increasing the number of people that vote in each election means better representation, more funding to our communities, and a better quality of life

- 1. Initially, we received a whatsapp collaboration message from Rotaract club of Mumbai Western Elite and we agreed for the collaboration.
- 2. The project was divided into two phases- Publicity & Registration Volunteer's Training and Registration, Status Update of Voter ID's.
- 3. Role of publicity volunteers included- Release of the project on the club's social media pages, Release of the project on club's GBM group, publicity of the project through other media, Release of the Registration volunteers' form, fulfilling the criteria of 3 Registration volunteers through their club, Update on the status of the Registrations received, etc.
- 4. Role of Registration volunteers included- Sending the list of documents to the allotted registrants, communicating with them for the date, time feasible for registration, Registration of new voters, filling out the google form with their EPIC ID and Updating the issues faced while registration, etc.
- 5. A meeting was then arranged by RCMWE wherein they explained the role of the publicity volunteers and the incentives. Following this, they release the form for Registration Volunteers. More than 450 volunteers joined. These volunteers were divided into 3 groups and communication was done through WhatsApp. Simultaneously, the RCMWE core team managed the release of the project officially on social media. A manual was shared with the Registration Volunteers to make the property can be represented by the project officially on social media. A manual was shared with the Registration Volunteers to make the property of the project of
- 6. Next, a volunteers training session was arranged. The registration process using the website and the application was explained using a PowerPoint presentation by Rtr. Labdhi Shah. She also covered the points of communication with the registrants, responding to queries, documents required, and the format in the documents that were supposed to be submitted. The session

- also included other miscellaneous things that were to be kept in mind while registering. This session was recorded and then, 2 other training sessions were held wherein the same recording was played and the queries of the volunteers were resolved. Post the training sessions, Voter's Registration Drive recordings and the PowerPoint presentation was forwarded to the volunteers along with the manual so that they could look it up easily.
- 7. Following this, different google forms were created for each club to keep a track of total registrations by each club. These forms asked for basic details about the registrant and what did they expect in the terms of a new voter's registration or correction of details, etc. Also, all the 67 clubs were informed to release the project on their social media the same day. These posters and messages were publicized to reach 2500+ registrations. The registration drive was then started on 1st November allowing people to register simultaneously. Each of the Registration volunteers was allotted 5-7 registrants and we had to update it to RCMVE volunteers about the status every 2 or 3 days. We also had to fill a google sheet after the registration is done so as to maintain a track. In case of any queries, the volunteers were asked to reach out to Rtr. Labdhi Shah, Rtr. Tanushree Saraf, Rtr. Hetansh Shah, Rtr. Ishita Kheria or Rtr. Khushi Chavan. A constant contact was there and all of the doubts were answered. The project concluded successfully on 17th December with over 2000 registrations for New Voter ID and over 500 corrections.

- · While there are some who genuinely cast their vote, many people sit back and relax on voting day, and others are cajoled into voting for particular candidates. The importance of voting is lost amongst the hustle and bustle of city life. While everyone si and complains about this and that, and makes suggestions that the government should change this and that, the elections come and go without half the population paying attention. The highest recorded voter turnout in India was recorded in 2014 for the Lok Sabha elections at 66.4%. That means close to half the population does not exercise their right
- to vote. After 69 years of Independence, India has not proved itself to have control and order. The fault lies with both the leaders and the people. People are driven by religious beliefs rather than what is good for the country. We should choose that which drives the country forward, while still upholding the Indian tradition. But politics is wound up in frivolous matters rather than paying more attention to uplifting the poor, helping the aged, education, water, preserving the environment, agriculture, roads, planned urban development, and so on. Hence with this project, we successfully registered 2000 new voters and helped over 500 people to make relevant changes in their Voter ID. This project not only motivated the youth to vote but made the process easier for them.

Feedback from the Chairpersons of the project: Voter's Registration Drive was a one-of-a-kind event for me to be a part of. What connected us most with it was the fact it was something that not only serves the purpose of social service but also breaks the stereotype that government documentation is cumbersome, time consuming, and not well designed. It opened our eye towards the government officials and individuals who have been putting in so much effort to provide similar services and enabled me to have a new level of respect for them. It was an amazing learning experience while working with a large group of people and being at the core of the Drive helped me learn how to manage such a large group. We were able to effectively leverage the knowledge we previously had and also share it with more people. This initiative also helped us to improve my management and organization skills. With so many steps and resources, on can easily be overwhelmed and lost, so to tackle that we came up with the Volunteer's booklet idea which was inspired by the MWE MUN delegate's kit which we had made. Also, tracking so many clubs, 2 types of volunteers, and registrations, making sure that all the numbers were well tallied, delegating the registrations to volunteers, communicating the same with the club representatives was a totally new and challenging experience. We also got to connect with so many new individuals while solving their doubts over calls or texts and it was so reviving to see their enthusiasm towards the event. We dearly hope that the endless nights and continuous efforts that our team had put in weren't in vain and we were able to create the effect that we desired.


