#### WHEREAS:

- A) First Party is a Higher Educational Institution named:

- B) First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.

- D) Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interest.
- Party is a Higher Educational Institution. Established in 1869 by the Society of Jesus, a Christian religious organization founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Xavier's College Autonomous, Mumbai (SXC) bears the name of St. Francis Xavier. Originally conceived to provide education to the Christian community in India, SXC has evolved over its 150-year history into an inclusive institution where individuals from diverse backgrounds are warmly welcomed. The Society of Jesus, with a rich tradition of global contributions to education, laid the foundation for SXC, and the college has since become a cradle of learning fostering an environment that transcends religious boundaries. The institute runs undergraduate and Masters programs in various branches such as Botany, Chemistry, Geology, Life Sciences, Microbiology and Ancient Indian Culture, Biotechnology, Physics, Big Data Analytics, Public Policy and Psychology. Eight departments have PhD recognition

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

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#### **CLAUSE 1 CO-OPERATION**

- Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Institution and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 First Party and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of First Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching / training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the industry, the Second Party.
- 1.3 The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

#### CLAUSE 2 SCOPE OF THE MOU

- 2.1 The budding graduates from the institutions can be benefitted by this Institute –Institute collaboration in terms of research, guest lectures, seminars, conferences, workshops and NAAC accreditation. Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- 2.2 Joint research activities: The parties agree to define and manage questions related to intellectual property such as ownership of industrial rights, patents, certificate of innovation, registry of models, and copyright of written materials, that may result from cooperative research, through the corresponding Specific Agreement.

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- 2.3 Curriculum Design: Both Parties will give valuable inputs to each other in teaching and research methodology and suitably customize the same so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.
- 2.4 Cooperative design of courses, conferences, symposia or academic programs:
   Both parties to extend the necessary support to deliver guest lectures to the students on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.5 Faculty Development Programs: Both Parties can organize the collaborative Faculty development program as per the academic requirement considering the updation of faculty knowledge
- 2.6 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the programs on the terms specified herein
- 2.7 Both parties will be responsible for their expenditure incurred or arising out of the collaboration. In case of any joint venture carried out by either or any single party, expenses will be borne by both, as mutually agreed or by the host institution.

#### **CLAUSE 3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY**

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

#### **CLAUSE 4 VALIDITY**

4.1 The MOU should enter into force on the date of signing. The MOU should remain in force for a period of five years from the date of signature until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period St. Xavier's College, Mumbai (Empowered Autonomous), the Second Party, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of St. Xavier's College, Mumbai (Empowered Autonomous), the Second Party after termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU

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Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' notice in 4.2 writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.

#### CLAUSE 5 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under 5.1 this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.

Any divergence or difference derived from the interpretation or application of the MoU shall be resolved by arbitration between the parties as per the Arbitration Act, 1996. The place of the arbitration shall be at District Head Quarters of the First Party. This undertaking is to be construed in accordance with Indian Law with exclusive jurisdiction in the Courts of Chembur.




